Arizona school OTs and OTAs must hold a license from the Arizona Board of Occupational Therapy Examiners. Information regarding obtaining a license to practice in Arizona is available at: <http://www.occupationaltherapyboard.az.gov>.

School-based OTs and OTAs must also obtain a valid Arizona identity verified print (IVP) fingerprint clearance card.

Nature of Work

The job of Occupational Therapist was established for the purpose of assessing students' functional physical development levels; planning and implementing appropriate treatment to meet individual student objectives; identifying architectural barriers; providing recommendations for accessibility, program development, and student placement; and providing direction to Certified Occupational Therapy Assistants.
